51/2018 PLANNING MATTERS

51.2018.1 Planning Applications for Consideration:

17/00596/FUL Change of use of land and formation of manege at Rose Cottage Whitelea Lane Tansley – object, there are concerns regarding the access for horse boxes, there is no facility for turning within the site and there are no visibility splays on what is a very busy road. There is no parking area for users of the manege shown on the application.

16/00779/DCOND Discharge of conditions 3,4,6,7,8,9,10, 14 and 15 at Land adjacent to 9 Oak Tree Gardens, Tansley – comments as follows:

Condition 7 - the temporary access has not yet been provided, site workers vehicles are currently being parked on the highway in the immediate area

Condition 9 - As yet there are no wheel wash facilities being provided on site Condition 10 - the permission to discharge this condition would appear to be premature as this condition has not been adhered to

Condition 14 - has a scheme been approved which prevents the discharge of water from the development into Oak Tree Gardens, the parish council would like to draw attention to Page 6 of the Planning Conditions particularly the SUDS maintenance, as there is a concern that responsibility will not be determined for scheme, and the Parish Council wish to protect the local residents from any incidence of flooding from groundwater run off.

Request for access over Footpath to the rear of Overcliffe Church Street to allow erection of log cabin, planning permission granted by DCC There was a discussion held regarding this request and it was **RESOLVED:**

To write back to the owner of Overcliffe with the following:

You have asked the Parish Council to allow you to cross a public footpath with a digger and a dumper truck to enable access to the rear of your property, you say access is needed to build a log cabin, there is no mention that planning permission was granted for an extension, you state access from the front of your property is less convenient for yourselves, we think access from the front of your property will be the most appropriate way to access your land.

The Parish Council also think using the front access will be the least damaging to the footpath, and to the trees and hedgerows.

You tell us the owner of Tansley House Gardens land has no objections to you crossing his land.

Tansley Parish Council oppose any access to your land via Tansley House Gardens.

To access your land it will be necessary to remove a mature holly hedge and at least three mature trees, to include silver birch. Removal of the hedge and mature trees will have an adverse effect upon the character of the area, which would be impossible to mitigate.

Looking at the map of TPO trees we question whether DDDC TPO 150/T34 is on your land -

We question whether you have applied for a diversion order from DCC Rights of Way, it is illegal to stop or divert a public footpath without going through the correct channels. The Parish Council help maintain the paths but we have no authority to divert or stop up a path, even for a limited time.

Your planning application form does not indicate you intend to divert a footpath, nor does it indicate you intend to remove valued trees and hedges to carry out this work.

The permission is for an extension not a replacement, should you be intending to replace the building we advise you to discuss this change to the application with DDDC Planning Officer Mrs H Frith.

To clarify Tansley Parish Council object to the destruction of hedges and trees adjacent to the public footpath 4, we also have serious concerns related to the 'opening up' of your boundary on to a public right of way. There is no indication that this boundary will be re-instated - The use of a digger and dumper truck traversing the footpath could seriously damage the footpath surface. There does not appear to be a licence to divert a footpath.

51.2018.3 Thatchers Lane –nothing to report, although DDDC Enforcement Officer has been informed of the conditions regarding the bund.

52/2018 ROAD SAFETY ISSUES A615

52.2018.1 Accident A615

There has been a further accident, the car ended up in Gregorys yard, due to another car going at speed on A615.

52.2018.2 **Petition - re A615** – Cllr Sue Burfoot informed the meeting that if a petition is presented to DCC they have to do something about it. **RESOLVED:** To take advice regarding a petition.

52.2018.3 No white lines from Church Street to Thompsons Nursery

There are no white lines or cats eyes, sine the road has been resurfaced, the reasoning from DCC is that because the highway is in a rural setting they have been left off, however it is felt that the omission of both is making the highway more dangerous.

51.2018.4 DCC - road traffic regulation A615 Matlock to Alfreton

The map and consultation letter were discussed, and it was felt that there are valid concerns related to existing speed limits that operate through this area, and request that DCC defer this matter until further discussions have been held regarding road traffic issues.

52/2018 ENVIRONMENTAL ISSUES.

52.2018.1 Old Coach Road – culvert has now been completed, although this would benefit from more hand rails; to protect children.

RESOLVED: to write regarding the provision of more handrails.

52.2018.2 Thatchers Lane New Planter – this has not been ordered yet.

52.2018.3 Green Lane – Drainage Issues

A drainage company have put a camera down and there appears to be nothing wrong, the gentleman who owns Whitelea Nursery has been met with, and he says that his land does not flood. A local resident informed the meeting that the watercourse appeared to have been diverted, which is why she no longer has any natural water.

52.2018.4 **Oaksedge Lane – the bridge –** nothing further has been received regarding this.

52.2018.5 **Street/Nottingham Road -** overhanging **Church** vegetation – this would be chased up to be dealt with.

52.2018.6 **The Cliff; new access opposite Smuse Lane –** this has been passed to DDDC Enforcement to deal with.

52.2018.7 **The Dams, Mount Pleasant Nottingham Road -** this is some concern about the engineering of these dams and whether planning permission is required.

RESOLVED:

To pass this matter to DDDC Enforcement Officer to deal with.
